## Quilted Shawl



## Materials:

$495^{\prime \prime}$ squares (1 charm square pack and 7 extra pieces)
$753 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares of matching fabric
$14^{\prime \prime}$ square of matching fabric
1.5 m backing fabric

Wadding
Binding $-2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 180^{\prime \prime}$ (Under $1 / 2 \mathrm{~m}$ of fabric will be required but joining will be required)
Finished size: $48^{\prime \prime} \times 48^{\prime \prime} \times 66.5^{\prime \prime}$
(I tend to make 2 shawls at a go because of the backing and wadding)

1) Take the $53 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares and cut them on the diagonal so there will be 14 half triangles.

2) Take the 4" square and cut on the diagonal. You only need 1 half square triangle for 1 shawl.
3) Starting at the narrow end, piece together as follows (make sure the end triangles face downwards as shown in the pictures below):

| 1 | 1 | join the one half triangle from the 4 " square to the bottom of the row 1 square and then join 2 half square triangles from the $53 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ square to either side of the square. |
| :---: | :---: | :---: |
| 2 | 3 | Join the 3 squares to together and then join 2 half square triangles from the $53 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ square to either side of the square. |
| 3 | 5 | Join the 5 squares to together and then join 2 half square triangles from the $53 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ square to either side of the square. |


| 4 | 7 | Join the 7 squares to together and then join 2 half square triangles from the $53 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ <br> square to either side of the square. |
| :--- | :--- | :--- |
| 5 | 9 | Join the 9 squares to together and then join 2 half square triangles from the $53 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ <br> square to either side of the square. |
| 6 | 11 | Join the 11 squares to together and then join 2 half square triangles from the <br> $53 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ square to either side of the square. |
| 7 | 13 | Join the 13 squares to together and then join 2 half square triangles from the <br> $53 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ square to either side of the square. |

The first 3 rows should look like this:

4) Join row 1 to 2 to 3 to 4 to 5 to 6 to 7 . You should have a triangular shape.
5) Cut backing fabric and wadding diagonally and sandwich the shawl - backing + wadding + shawl top
6) Either quilt the sandwich or use decorative stitches along the seams.
7) Get your Binding ready. This should be $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 180^{\prime \prime}$
8) Add binding and finish off your shawl.
